directly into Flagstaff Airport.

Flagstaff is located at the base of the San Francisco  
Peaks mountain range, a sacred site for  
many Native American tribes. It is also about 20 minutes  
from the Navajo Nation, the country's  
largest Native American reservation, and is less than 2  
hours from the Grand Canyon.
